## Research Interests

My research focuses on leveraging information (records and archives) for development, accountability and good governance. I have investigated the international, regional and national legal framework underpinning freedom of information and data protection. The advent of data driven technologies has resulted in a datafied society. In this regard, I am fascinated by topics covering contemporary issues related to surveillance capitalism, information ethics and data justice.

My current work focuses on fostering inclusivity, trust and safeguarding privacy in data management systems.

Lately, many countries have prioritized provision of legal identity to their citizens by establishing unique identity management systems. Whilst implementing identity management systems is a useful step towards closing the proof of identity gap and ensuring efficient access to essential services, ensuring that the systems are inclusive and trusted to safeguard privacy remains a challenge. My current project focuses on identifying the privacy risks inherent in the implementation of the National Integrated Identity Management System (NIIMs) in Kenya. While the government has sought to assure citizens that the personal data held in the system is safe, these assurances are not backed by credible data on the privacy risks and protective measures within the NIIM system.

In view of this, I intend to fill this research gap by undertaking a privacy impact assessment to identify the privacy risks associated with implementation of the NIIM system. Specifically, the study will outline the functions and business needs that the system seeks to fulfil and how this can be done while maintaining privacy of personal data; identify the privacy governance framework underpinning the operation of the system; assessing the system design features and the extent to which they adhere to privacy principles; identifying problematic data actions within the system that could undermine data privacy and proposing measures for mitigating the identified privacy risks.
